- 4. There were several instances where if one circumstance in a child's life had changed for the better, he or she could have had a much better chance of avoiding homelessness. Which of these near-misses frustrated you the most?
- 5. Do you think the young people made any bad choices in the book? Would you have made the same decisions as they did? Why or why not?
- 6. None of the children grew up with a consistent father figure in their home. Do you think a consistent father figure is crucial to young people, why or why not?
- 7. From reading these stories, who do you think is most responsible for helping kids avoid becoming homeless: parents, the child welfare system, the young people themselves, schools, the government, or nonprofits?
- 8. What would you do to help your child if you were Muriel's parents? Meagan's? Creionna's?
- 9. How has reading this book changed your opinion of a certain person or topic?
- 10. Has the knowledge you've gained through reading these stories inspired you do anything to help homeless young people?
